Headteacher update




Mr Brooke - Headteacher - enjoying one of his regular story time sessions with Key Stage 1


Online authors and illustrators








100 Book Challenge

Over the last year my daughter has improved massively with her reading, she is now such a confident reader and it's amazing to see just how well she is doing.

My son loves to read and a love of reading is installed from a very early age at Alex Park.

My children have really surprised me since staring in reception and how quickly they recognise sounds and letters.

I see it in their writing and requests for books.

My daughter loves the 100 book challenge and the way the children review the books with each other in class. She has requested several books for Christmas that have been reviewed by her friends in class as part of the challenge.

Louie has come on leaps and bounds with his reading. He loves it and the school has had a huge impact on this. He is reading at a great level.

My son is becoming a more fluent reader and is trying a wider selection of books from all the good work within school on the love of reading.

My child loves everything about books. He loves stories and science knowledge-based books. He is making huge improvements with his reading, which I believe is credit to the school.


Authors of the month!







Key Stage One... Teacher Readers


