
## <u>Attendance</u>

Over the Autumn term the Government's research into attendance has highlighted some every concerning national trends. From previous covid levels, there is a 70% increase nationally in unauthorised absence. This is obviously a huge concern. Their second finding is as obvious as it is concerning too. 'Missing school can seriously undermine a child's education and future life chances.' Our own data shows that when children miss school they find school much more challenging. For some, this is academic, for others it is social and emotional, and unfortunately for too many it is both. The reason I'm writing this is we want to work with

parents to help improve children's attendance and, as the research shows, life chances. We know when we have worked with parents we have been able to improve attendance and how well children are doing as an overall. Either myself, Mrs Millward or Mrs Lockett will be increasing the support we offer around attendance. Even if something is a national trend, it does not mean it needs to be an Alexandra Park trend. I want the best for every child at this school and if there is a barrier to this goal, such as attendance, then I and my team will do everything we can to remove it. ### Reception


