## <u>Year 1</u>

#### Year 4 Trip to Chester

The children loved their trip to Chester to learn more about the Romans. They put on armour and carried shields on a fun visit to the amphitheatre led by a Roman soldier called Atticus. They also took on the role of Roman builders and slaves as well as finding out how archaeologists learn about the past.





## Year 6 - Design and Technology

Year 6 have had a fantastic time this week designing and creating their own wooden toys for children in reception. They have explored the use of different CAMS and evaluated their work effectively throughout the whole process. We were extremely impressed with their teamwork, resilience and pride. #### World Book Day - Thursday 2nd March

We will be celebrating World Book Day on Thursday 2nd March. As in previous years, we will not be asking children to dress up. This year, to celebrate our love of reading, we have organised a very special way in which our children can not only celebrate but also demonstrate our school value of Care. We are launching an appeal called 'Share a story'. As a school who love reading, and have been enjoying our own new school library, we're partnering with a Primary School in The Gambia to help equip them with a school library.

The link with the school is through Miss Erskine, who lived in The Gambia for sixteen years and went back to teach at the school from 2019-2020. Children in The Gambia love reading but most of them have very limited access to books, if any.

We're asking you to partner with us by donating any children's books that you no longer need. We'll be collecting the books on World Book Day (Thursday 2nd March) and shipping them to The Gambia. Ideally, we'd like books that are still in good condition so that we can equip the school with books that will last a long time. There is also the option to make a monetary donation on World Book Day that will be used to cover the cost of shipping the books to The Gambia.

We are very proud to be supporting such a worthwhile cause. In assembly, Miss Erskine will talk to the children about the school in The Gambia, her experiences and the new library that the books the children donate will create.

We also have a multi award winning author visit for our children in Years 5 and 6! Elle McNicoll will talk to the children about her new book Like a Curse. This is the follow up to Like a Charm that we know many of the children have enjoyed already. Children will have the chance to buy a signed copy of her latest book, more information will follow after half term.
