#### **Year 6 Science Day**

On Wednesday, Year 6 had a full day of science. The aim of the day was to work scientifically, sorting and classifying items that will float and sink, completing a fair test to investigate whether the surface area of an object affects how quickly it sinks and pattern seeking, where they found out if there was a relationship between the length of your foot and the length from your wrist to your elbow. They also were dropping balls into flour and investigating whether the mass of the ball affects the size of the crater it's created.
