Pupil Premium

Following up on the message you will have received on seesaw, as a school we are passionate about ensuring every child has the greatest chance of success. Our school data for last year shows that our Pupil Premium children make 4 times the national average progress in maths and reading! This is amazing for them! Schools receive additional funding for any child who qualifies for Pupil Premium which we spend on ensuring these children benefit from the highest quality teaching possible and additional support wherever they need it. This might be academic or for their wellbeing. We want as many children to benefit from this additional support as possible so we can help them make this outstanding progress. In addition to this in-school support, families who

qualify for Pupil Premium receive additional payments to help with the cost of living from the Local Authority. This is currently £60 per child which, if you are eligible you should receive this week. To help support families we have purchased an IT support package where we can now apply for Pupil Premium for you! The criteria could be any of these areas:

- Income Support
- income-based Jobseekers Allowance
- income-related Employment and Support Allowance
- Universal Credit (provided your household income is less than £7,400 a year after tax and not including any benefits you get)
- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of State Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you are not entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for 4 weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
