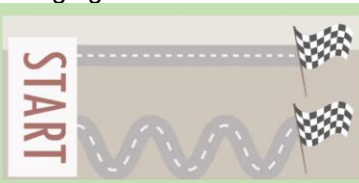
To all our Year 6,

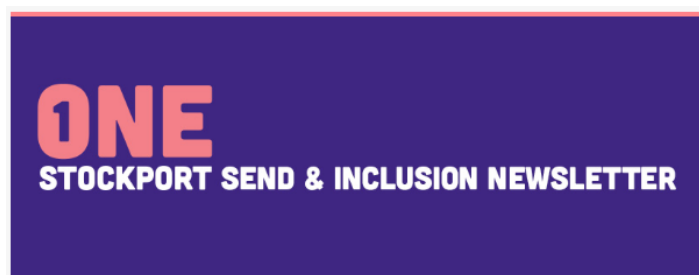
